Project Description

Construction of new structural steel overhead baffle system at the moving man target and alley firing ranges, at the Illinois State Police Firing Range in Pawnee, Illinois.

Project also included:

- placement of projectile containment material
- a new moving target system
- use of armor resistant steel plate
- upgrades to the existing earthen berm
- construction of a metal building for the new rifle shooting range.

Project Details

- Emergency project to upgrade the facility for protection of the public.
- Erection of 40 tons of AR-500 armor resistant steel for the overhead structure.
- Placement of over 12,000 square feet of ballistic tile material.
- Construction of new target pads and a 3,000 square foot metal building, for rifle shooting.

Unique Challenges

- Fast build schedule – 45 days for completion.
- Procurement of the armor resistant steel with current demand by U.S. Military.
- Completion of owner-initiated project changes within schedule requirements.
- Minimizing disruption to the Illinois State Police Training Facility.
